COMMUNITY STEPS UP FOR LOCKDOWN



During lockdown Mark, along with the Church Hill *Focus* team, gave up their time to help vulnerable members of our community. Mark and *Focus* team members delivered over a thousand leaflets to residents in Church Hill and other parts of Redditch as part of the Support Redditch Emergency Network response. Mark collected prescriptions for those who were unable to leave their homes during the height of the pandemic. He continues to be a volunteer for Redditch East Stronger Together (REST), who offer support to those who need it.

Talking about the lockdown, Mark said, **'The Coronavirus has really shown me just how much we rely on people who are often undervalued for the amazing work they do. We have the fantastic staff at the NHS and Alexandra Hospital - the porters, cleaners, administrators, nurses, doctors, ambulance staff, the 111 service and our GPs (to name but a few) who have all worked tirelessly to help keep us safe and well during these challenging times.**

But we must not forget the shop workers, delivery drivers, teachers, postmen and postwomen, refuse collectors and everyone else who has selflessly put the wellbeing of the community above their own. I'd like to say a heartfelt thank you for everything you do for us, not just during the height of the pandemic but every single day. You are all our heroes.'

CLEANING UP IN CHURCH HILL

Over the last few months we have seen an increase in fly tipping in the area and Mark has been making it his mission to report it and get it picked up. So far Mark has reported dumped mattresses, bed frames, fridges, lawn mowers, window frames, washing machines, pallets, a halogen cooker and even a pair of car wheels! He also made sure a felled road sign was replaced on Melbury Way.

FIX OUR FOOTPATHS

During his walkabouts around Church Hill, Mark has noticed that many of the footpaths are in a bad condition. Slabs are broken, tree roots have broken through making paths uneven and the 'repairs' that have been made are shoddy quick fixes that make the paths difficult to use, particularly for people with push chairs, wheel chairs and mobility issues.

Mark has launched a petition calling on Worcestershire County Council and Redditch Borough Council to Fix our Footpaths and is asking local residents to add their name.
